This year Hillel celebrated 30 years, and if there's one thing that we've learned over three decades of service, it's that absolutely everyone needs support.


That's why 2021 saw us expanding infrastructure to meet increasing participant need, and laying strong foundations for necessary organizational growth in the coming years. The goal is simple: That absolutely every young adult considering leaving Haredi communities anywhere in Israel knows that they can succeed; and that they will be fully held in the process.

To this end, 2021 saw Hillel advocacy efforts secure governmental support for Yotzim B'sheilah in the amount of NIS 8 million; the formation of a government task force for Yotzeh affairs; and the public declaration by Alternate Prime Minister Yair Lapid that advancement of Yotzim B'sheilah is now a core domestic social policy focus.

In preparation, Hillel has been breaking new ground for the inauguration of a Center in Beersheva in 2022 with attendant housing units in nearby Kibbutz Hatzerim, for the doubling of our transitional housing capacity in Jerusalem and Tel Aviv, and for the replication of our Jerusalem HaBayit shell Hillel (Hillel's House) Emergency Shelter in Tel Aviv.

The next three years will see extensive progress in our ability to provide physical and emotional support for Yotzim B'sheilah wherever they are, and whatever their needs. We could not even have begun to consider preparations for these next stages in our journey without the dedicated work of our volunteers and staff, and the committed assistance of our donors.

On behalf of Hillel, and the community of Yotzim B'sheilah in Israel we thank you all. And we look forward to the next three decades.




2021 Financials Income Breakdown

Total Income NIS 13,619,745


Income by sources



Israel NIS 10,255,960




International NIS 3,363,785
